**Formed in 1989, Leeds United Ladies has been one of the country's top women's sides for most of the last decade.**

After seven years playing in the Yorkshire & Humberside league, the season 1997/98 saw the first team gain promotion to the AXA FA Northern Premier League. After consolidating and adjusting to National league football for a couple of seasons they then achieved promotion as champions of the Northern Premier League, the same season also saw them play in the semi finals of the Women's FA Cup for the first time. They then gained promotion in 2001/02 to the FA National League where they finished a very credible fourth.

2003/04 saw the team once again in fourth place, and the highest placed team outside London. In 2004/05 the team finished fifth, while 2005/06 saw the team achieve its first appearance in the Women's FA Cup final.

2006/07 was an up and down season with Leeds topping the table over the Christmas period and getting through to the Premier League Cup Final, when they narrowly lost 1-0 in the 90th minute against Arsenal and eventually finished fifth in the league.

Over the summer of 2007 the youth teams amalgamated with the Leeds United Girls Centre of Excellence to form one organisation feeding into the open age team.

The club had several members of the first squad who had progressed through from the youth teams, including England regulars Gemma Bonner and Jess Clarke, Sophie Walton, Olivia Thackray and Mel Sutcliffe.

Rick Passmoor was appointed Manager in July 2007, and brought in new signings including Steph Houghton, Carly Telford, Katie Holtham and Jade Moore, while the partnership with Leeds Metropolitan University brought in players such as Emma Higgins from Northern Ireland.

In 2008, Carla Cantrell and Ellen White arrived, while the summer of 2009 saw the arrival of Nat Stanef, Laura Bassett and Remi Allen.

The blend of home-grown talent with regular England internationals saw the club have its most successful period ever. As well as the Premier League Cup win against Everton in 2010, and a second FA Cup Final appearance in 2008, the club was made Club of the Year in the 2010 Leeds Sports Federation Awards and finished fourth, just three points and a few goals away from Europe. Rick Passmoor deservedly collected the Premier League Manager of the Season award from the FA.

But the successes of 2009-10 came against the backdrop of the end of the partnership with Leeds Metropolitan University, the club having its funding and Super League application withdrawn in January 2010, just two weeks before that Premier League Cup Final win.

In July 2010, the club re-adopted the Leeds United Ladies name when it was taken under the wing of the Leeds United Foundation, but is now independently funded by local businesses and people - such as our Chairman, Steve Russell - with a genuine interest in women's football. Reserves manager Gemma Grainger stepped up to run the first team, but with results going against the club Rick Passmoor came back for the second half of a difficult transitional season.

Despite having a young and inexperienced squad, the club eventually finished fourth in the eight-team league and won the County Cup for the sixth time in the past ten years.

One of the people Rick brought to the bench was former coach Chris Welburn, and in the summer of 2011 he was appointed manager. His work in building up the squad and taking it to greater heights has already begun, with key signings in Sarah Danby, Emma Johnson, Billie Murphy, Amy Turner and Vanessa Holmes - and more to follow.

'Kez' joined the Centre of Excellence at the age of 8, eventually joining the successful reserves side when only 15 years old. A stylish and skilful player, Kez was a key member of the reserves league and County Cup-winning teams of 2007-08 and 2008-09.



## 10. Tanya Rich

Forward  
Born 5 December 1984  
Last season's top scorer, Tanya came through the ranks at Leeds and was a member of the all-conquering reserves team in 2007-08 before leaving to gain experience elsewhere. She has now revived her partnership with Huegett at the front of the Leeds formation.



## 11. Leah Galton

Midfielder  
Born 24 May 1994  
Leah is the youngest member of the squad, but still has a wealth of footballing experience under her belt, having become an England regular while still at Leeds Girl's Centre of Excellence.



## 12. Bekki Bass

Midfielder  
Born 16 May 1994  
Bekki was one of three 16 year olds who joined the squad last year, having graduated from North Yorkshire's Centre of Excellence.



## 14. Sarah Danby

Midfielder  
Born 7 April 1991  
A tricky left winger who joined Leeds from Manchester City in the summer of 2011. A former Sunderland WFC Player, Sarah will be another good addition to the squad. Sarah studies at Leeds Metropolitan University and has represented England Universities in 2010 and also Great Britain at the World University Games in China in 2011.



## 15. Vanessa Holmes

Defender  
Born 29 September 1984  
Vanessa was another of Chris Welburn's first signings in July 2011. She brings with her a wealth of Premier League experience, having played top-flight football for most of her career.

# Match report

Leeds hit the top in style. *Words by Jamie Gillham.*

**Leeds 5-0 Aston Villa  
Sunday 2 October**

Leeds produced a stunning 5-0 home win over Aston Villa as they continued their fine early season form at Throstle Nest on Sunday.

With both teams sitting in the top three entering into the contest hopes were high for a competitive and entertaining match but in truth the visitors were unable to match their hosts energy and execution in what quickly became a one-sided contest.

Leeds opened the scoring in the fourteenth minute as Hayley Sharp outmuscled her marker to apply a clinical finish at the far post following a wonderfully flighted Jess Holbrook corner.

Leeds continued to press forward and deservedly doubled their lead with 33 minutes on the clock as forward Millie Bright poked home from close range. The striker showing great awareness to volley home with her outstretched right boot after being quickest to react to the loose ball following good work from Leah Galton and Sarah Danby.

With half time approaching Leeds continued to press forward and were unlucky not to register a third as both Millie Bright

and Sarah Danby came close to scoring. The best of those chances falling to Bright, who after dispossessing fullback Erin Vaughan in the box was only able to slice her shot wide right from a tight angle.

The second half was barely thirty seconds old when the effervescent Bright quickly made amends for her earlier miss with a spectacular solo effort. Having picked up the ball ten yards into Villa territory the Sheffield youngster beat two defenders before swerving an unstoppable left foot drive into the far top corner of the net, her third of the season.

With the contest all but settled Leeds continued to dominate the play as they pressed forward in search of more goals. In the 72nd minute substitute Tanya Rich latched onto a pin point through ball before cutting inside the fullback and sliding home a

composed finish to increase the lead to four.

Leeds completed the scoring only two minutes later as Rich added her second with an effort that just about summed up Villa's day. Following neat interplay around the box, forward Rich struck a speculative long range right foot chip which crashed off the underside of the bar before ricocheting off the back of Villa keeper Megan Walsh and back into the net via the post. It was a cruel stroke of luck for a Villa side that despite plenty of enthusiasm had been well beaten on the day.

Speaking after the game Leeds manager Chris Welburn was understandably delighted with his side's performance, "I was very pleased with the team today. We produced our best football of the season against a side that've had a great start to the season and on top of that it's another clean sheet."

The international stage saw England reach the Quarter Final of the World Cup in Germany, the national game introduced the new FA Women's Super League and the grass roots game saw radical but much-needed changes to the Centre of Excellence structure.

The past few months have seen countless hours of work to ensure that Leeds United were successful in their bid and deservedly received the accreditation needed to be part of this new structure.

With fond memories as a player and coach at the club I was delighted to be asked by Rick Passmoor to be part of this evolving set-up as Technical Director. This role includes implementing the coaching programme and mentoring the coaches to ensure the delivery of programmes to maximise the players' potential.

The season has started well with improved performances evident throughout all age groups on a weekly basis. It goes without question that all players have the technical/tactical potential ability but at present we are working to show them the importance of the person (social and

psychological) in reaching their potential as a player.

Such personal development took place last week when all age groups attended the first team fixture to witness an excellent passing and disciplined display which was a valuable lesson and learning tool for players and staff.

As part of this development I would like to thank Chris and his staff for welcoming the introduction of the U17's observation rota which enables the players to go in the changing room pre-, during and post-match to soak in the atmosphere and

experience the step up that they are aiming to achieve within the next few years.

Finally I would like to thank the players, parents and staff for their continued efforts. Week by week I will do my utmost to raise standards but I am fully aware that this is a joint effort and requires the teamwork of everyone at the Centre of Excellence, and Leeds United Ladies as well.

# Today's opponents

## Sunderland Women have been for the last 9 years, the highest ranking women's football team in the North East.

Sunderland Women were formed 9 years ago when East Durham Houghall Kestrels and Sunderland Ladies combined to come under the umbrella of 'Sunderland Women'. Prior to this their roots lay in Tyneside with Blyth Spartans Kestrels.

Since the merger Sunderland Women FC have consistently performed to a very high standard. They have played four seasons in the Northern Division and three seasons in the Women's Premier League.

In the seasons 2002/2003 and 2003/2004 Sunderland Women finished runners up in the Northern Division, only just missing promotion to the premiership on both occasions.

Season 2004 – 2005 saw Sunderland secure promotion to the Premier League winning the Northern Division by 6 clear points. For the first time in their history they reached the quarter finals of the Women's FA Cup, only losing to a strong Charlton team in the last few minutes of the game.

Season 2005 – 2006 ended with the club retaining their position in the top flight despite losing the financial backing of parent club SAFC.

Season 2006 – 2007 – Sunderland were relegated to the Premier Northern Division.

Season 2007 – 2008 – Due to relegation Sunderland Women lost some of their international players but after a disappointing start to the campaign Sunderland finished third in the Northern Division and was looking to build on their position.

Season 2008 - 2009 – One of the most successful seasons for the club gaining an increased local and national profile. Sunderland Women FC achieved runners up in the FA Women's cup final after losing 2-1 to National Premier League Champions Arsenal, also receiving the E.ON Team of the Round Award twice.

Season 2008 - 2009 – One of the most successful seasons for the club gaining an increased local and national profile. Sunderland Women FC achieved runners up in the FA Women's cup final after losing 2-1 to National Premier League Champions Arsenal, also receiving the E.ON Team of the Round Award twice.

Secured promotion back to the National Premier League after winning the Northern Division and Manager Mick Mulhern received Tesco Manager of the Year at the FA Women's Football Awards.

Sunderland Women currently have two England U23s internationals, five in the England Under 19 squad, together with 2 players in the England Under 17 squad. Alongside Everton, Leeds and Birmingham Sunderland have

supplied more players into the England International set up than any other clubs in the whole league structure.

We also have a highly successful reserve team who have secured their place in Division 1 of the Premier League Northern/Midlands Section after winning the Division 2 title.

With the recent retirement of Vic Akers (Arsenal Ladies FC Manager) Sunderland Women FC's Manager, Mick Mulhern is now currently the longest serving manager in the league (10 years at end of September).
