**Formed in 1989, Leeds United Ladies has been one of the country's top women's sides for most of the last decade.**

After seven years playing in the Yorkshire & Humberside league, the season 1997/98 saw the first team gain promotion to the AXA FA Northern Premier League. After consolidating and adjusting to National league football for a couple of seasons they then achieved promotion as champions of the Northern Premier League, the same season also saw them play in the semi finals of the Women's FA Cup for the first time. They then gained promotion in 2001/02 to the FA National League where they finished a very credible fourth.

2003/04 saw the team once again in fourth place, and the highest placed team outside London. In 2004/05 the team finished fifth, while 2005/06 saw the team achieve its first appearance in the Women's FA Cup final.

2006/07 was an up and down season with Leeds topping the table over the Christmas period and getting through to the Premier League Cup Final, when they narrowly lost 1-0 in the 90th minute against Arsenal and eventually finished fifth in the league.

Over the summer of 2007 the youth teams amalgamated with the Leeds United Girls Centre of Excellence to form one organisation feeding into the open age team.

The club had several members of the first squad who had progressed through from the youth teams, including England regulars Gemma Bonner and Jess Clarke, Sophie Walton, Olivia Thackray and Mel Sutcliffe.

Rick Passmoor was appointed Manager in July 2007, and brought in new signings including Steph Houghton, Carly Telford, Katie Holtham and Jade Moore, while the partnership with Leeds Metropolitan University brought in players such as Emma Higgins from Northern Ireland.

In 2008, Carla Cantrell and Ellen White arrived, while the summer of 2009 saw the arrival of Nat Staneff, Laura Bassett and Remi Allen.

The blend of home-grown talent with regular England internationals saw the club have its most successful period ever. As well as the Premier League Cup win against Everton in 2010, and a second FA Cup Final appearance in 2008, the club was made Club of the Year in the 2010 Leeds Sports Federation Awards and finished fourth, just three points and a few goals away from Europe. Rick Passmoor deservedly collected the Premier League Manager of the Season award from the FA.

But the successes of 2009-10 came against the backdrop of the end of the partnership with Leeds Metropolitan University, the club having its funding and Super League application withdrawn in January 2010, just two weeks before that Premier League Cup Final win.

In July 2010, the club re-adopted the Leeds United Ladies name when it was taken under the wing of the Leeds United Foundation, but is now independently funded by local businesses and people - such as our Chairman, Steve Russell - with a genuine interest in women's football. Reserves manager Gemma Grainger stepped up to run the first team, but with results going against the club Rick Passmoor came back for the second half of a difficult transitional season.

Despite having a young and inexperienced squad, the club eventually finished fourth in the eight-team league and won the County Cup for the sixth time in the past ten years.

One of the people Rick brought to the bench was former coach Chris Welburn, and in the summer of 2011 he was appointed manager. His work in building up the squad and taking it to greater heights has already begun, with key signings in Sarah Danby, Emma Johnson, Billie Murphy, Amy Turner and Vanessa Holmes - and more to follow.

Jules stepped into the first team having helped the reserves retain both league and county cup titles in 2008-09. She has represented England at Under-17 level, including at the World Cup in 2008 and is a Centre of Excellence graduate.



## 2. Emma Coates

Defender  
Born 29 April 1991  
Emma is another Leeds player who came through from the reserves. Sadly she spent most of the last 12 months recovering from an injury but she's now working her way back into contention.



## 3. Stacey Emmonds

Defender  
Born 28 November 1986  
Stacey is one of the many graduates from Leeds United who move away to gain experience elsewhere, and has already made that experience count since rejoining Leeds last summer. Her season was curtailed by injury but she is once again back in contention.



## 4. Hayley Sharp

Hayley is another 'prodigal daughter', part of the winning reserves side in 2007-08 and who made a big impact last season.

Captain Clare also joined Leeds in the summer of 2010, and brings experience to the central midfield and, when needed, into the back four.



## 9. Carey Huegett

Forward  
Born 23 July 1991  
'Kez' joined the Centre of Excellence at the age of 8, eventually joining the successful reserves side when only 15 years old. A stylish and skilful player, Kez was a key member of the reserves league and County Cup-winning teams of 2007-08 and 2008-09.



## 10. Tanya Rich

Forward  
Born 5 December 1984  
Last season's top scorer, Tanya came through the ranks at Leeds and was a member of the all-conquering reserves team in 2007-08 before leaving to gain experience elsewhere. She has now revived her partnership with Huegett at the front of the Leeds formation.



## 11. Leah Galton

Midfielder  
Born 24 May 1994  
Leah is the youngest member of the squad, but still has a wealth of footballing experience under her belt, having become an England regular while still at Leeds Girl's Centre of Excellence.



## 12. Bekki Bass

Midfielder  
Born 16 May 1994  
Bekki was one of three 16 year olds who joined the squad last year, having graduated from North Yorkshire's Centre of Excellence.



## 14. Sarah Danby

Midfielder  
Born 7 April 1991  
A tricky left winger who joined Leeds from Manchester City in the summer of 2011. A former Sunderland WFC Player, Sarah will be another good addition to the squad. Sarah studies at Leeds Metropolitan University and has represented England Universities in 2010 and also Great Britain at the World University Games in China in 2011.



## 15. Vanessa Holmes

Defender  
Born 29 September 1984  
Vanessa was another of Chris Welburn's first signings in July 2011. She brings with her a wealth of Premier League experience, having played top-flight football for most of her career.



## 16. Emma Johnson

Midfielder  
Born 12 October 1991  
Emma was one of Chris Welburn's first signings in July 2011. A fast, versatile and pacy player.



## 17. Amy Turner

Defender  
Born 4 July 1991  
Amy joined Leeds in August 2011 from Super League side Doncaster Rovers Belles, before which she had played in the US while a student at Hofstra University. She has been involved with the England U15 and U17 squads and will now be looking to continue her development while now playing at a higher level.



## 18. Billie Murphy

Defender  
Born 27 January 1993  
Billie is a summer signing for Leeds, having previously played for and captained Arsenal Ladies Reserves.



## 19. Millie Bright

Forward  
Born 21 August 1993  
Millie joins Leeds from Doncaster Rovers Belles as one of two dual signings. a strong, athletic forward who is dual signed with ourselves and FAWSL side Doncaster Belles. A product of the Sheffield United Centre of Excellence, Millie will be looking to make an impact with us over the next couple of months.

Jess started her career at Everton Centre of Excellence where she competed in both the Under-14s and Under-16s age groups. She then went on to make her full debut in the 2008/2009 season against Millwall. She ruptured her ACL while playing for England Under-20s in 2010, and is making a return to fitness after 8 months out.

Missing from the team for the last ten days has been recent signing Jess Holbrook, who joined up with the England Under 23 party.

During a frustrating eight month injury lay off for a ruptured ACL, sustained playing for England in the 2010 Under 20's World Cup, midfielder Jess dreamed of nothing more than the opportunity to once again play the game she loves. With her knee now healthy, the 19 year old former Everton Centre of Excellence graduate has the opportunity to do just that at her new home here in Leeds.

With five league starts under her belt already and Leeds currently topping the Women's Premier League table, it comes as little surprise to find that the former England under 19 European Championship winner has settled in quickly to life in white, "I've really enjoyed my time at the club so far. There's a really great group of girls who've all made me feel very welcome."

When considering her future during the off season Holbrook admits she was drawn to Leeds due to its reputation for high standards and since her arrival, the Sports Diploma student has not been disappointed, "I've been really impressed so far. Training has been sharp and there's a lot of talent spread right throughout the squad. I think the competition for places is particularly impressive, the manager's got two or three legitimate options in almost every position."

As for Leeds promising start to this season Holbrook admits that, "It's been a very encouraging start to the season. At times we've put in some really good performances but there's also been some periods where we've not performed how we know we can. We've laid a decent platform but it's important that we keep pushing ourselves and continue to build. Everyone associated with the squad is determined to work hard to improve week after week and make this season as successful as we possibly

# Match reports

## Leeds 2-2 Barnet Sunday 23 October

Leeds slid off the top of the FA Women's Premier League National Division with an entertaining, but frustrating 2-2 draw at home to Barnet FC Ladies.

Carey Huegett had already hit the cross bar when she opened the scoring in the 9th minute, heading in from close range from a Jess Holbrook corner, and Leeds had by far the better of the first half. Indeed, had not Emma Davies and Renata Inniss not cleared off the line from successive shots from Hayley Sharp and Clare Sykes, Leeds would have felt that the scoreline was much more a reflection of the way the game was going.

But it was Barnet who came out

the brighter of the two teams at the start of the second half, and slowly began to push the action back towards the Leeds goal. Their endeavour was rewarded in the 66th minute when a free kick floated in behind the Leeds defence, allowing sub Hannah Short to score from close range.

Barnet took the lead two minutes later when Cheryl Williams made space on the right and fired home from the edge of the box – Leeds keeper Jules Draycott got a hand to it but could nothing to stop it.

Leeds got back into the game in the 82nd minute thanks to a solo run down the right and into the box from Leah Galton, pulling the ball back for Jess Holbrook to score, before Barnet's Vicky Boardman inexplicably flapped an arm at the ball to give away

a penalty two minutes later. Regular penalty taker Sykes stepped up, but this time could only hammer the ball onto the crossbar to leave the score even.

"Barnet, I think, are the best teams we've played this season," said Leeds manager Chris Welburn. "We played well for the first 45 minutes and should have scored more from the set-pieces we had, as we always looked dangerous. But in the second half, Barnet stepped up the pace and hit us hard.

"Despite going 2-1 down, it was pleasing to see the attitude and character of the players to get back into the game and nearly win it at the end."

## Coventry 0-1 Leeds Sunday 30 October

Leeds United Ladies took all three points and some measure of revenge against Coventry City Ladies for the reverse fixture in September, which Coventry won.

Both sides looked to get control in a pacy opening first half with Leah Galton hitting the woodwork twice after turning her markers inside and out, Faye Birkby hit the crossbar from a lob while Tanya Rich had an attempt ruled out for offside.

Coventry were awarded a penalty when Birkby was judged to have brought down Kerry Bartlett just before half time, but Katy Male's penalty hit the right-hand post and bounced back into play. Though she followed the miss by putting the ball into the net she was the only player to have touched the ball, which was ruled as a double play of the ball and Leeds were awarded a free kick instead.

It was Leeds who took command of the second half, and opened the scoring in the 57th minute when Clare Sykes picked up the ball out on the right, passed to

Carey Huegett who ran it to the line and crossed perfectly for Hayley Sharp to get her fourth of the season.

Leeds made most of the chances in the remaining half hour, with Emma Johnson hitting the crossbar from distance and Millie Bright intercepting a poor pass back but having her shot saved by Coventry keeper Susan Wood. But the single goal was enough to move Leeds above Coventry, level on points with Sunderland and behind them by four goals.

"Today was a performance full of character and grit," said Leeds

manager Chris Welburn. "We were resolute in our defending and full of energy right throughout the team. I am really pleased to pick up the three points and keep our 100% away record going and stretch it to five wins on the road. We must now kick on and as always look to set the highest standards we can each week."

# Today's opponents

## The earliest known Forest Ladies Team competed in the Notts and Derby League in the early 1970s.

**Year 1990** After a 12 week training course at the City Ground, a small group of young women advertised for more players in the Forest v Everton match day programme. From this the current Forest Ladies Club was formed and played in the East Midlands League.

**Early/mid 1990** During the decade they achieved promotion to the First Division only to be relegated back to Division Two after two seasons.

They returned to the First Division and achieved as high as 6th place before it was changed to the Premier Division.

**Year 1996** Donna Hilton and Lisa Dawkins, players from the original 1990 side, continued to play while setting up a Forest Ladies Junior Section. They began in season 1996/97 with an Under 12 and an Under 14 team.

**Summer 2000** Forest Ladies join with Fay Glover in the running of the Victoria Trophy in its

**Season 2000/01** The Women's First team finished third in the league and were victorious in their Premiership Cup Final beating Lincoln.

**Summer 2002** Lisa Dawkins takes on a new role as First Team Player/Manager.

Donna Hilton retired from the Club to concentrate on her increasing vocational role.

**December 2002** NFLFC is awarded the FA Charter Standards Community Club Award, the highest of the three Charter Standard levels.

**2002/2003** Forest Ladies gain promotion to The Midland Women's Combination League.

**2003/2004** Joint 1st in Midlands Combinations (Runners up on Goal Difference), County Cup Winners, National FA Womens Cup Quarter Finalists

**2004/2005** The Victoria Trophy was deemed to be one of the best ever in closer links with Nottingham City Council with over 250 teams entering.

Most significantly is the result of the 1st Team who finally get promoted to the FA Women's Premier League, Northern Division.

**2005/2006** The 1st team and Reserves are both placed in 5th place in their first appearance in the Northern Premier League and all the junior sides perform well.

**2006/2007** Both Senior teams earn a 3rd place spot respectively in the Premier League - Northern Division and Midlands Reserve Division 2. The junior sides perform well with notable success for the Under 14s and Under 16s winning their respective leagues in the Notts Girls and Ladies League.

A significant change of direction for Forest Ladies takes place with the junior section now switching to Centre of Excellence status under the Nottingham Forest Ladies umbrella. This is now funded by the F.A and supports qualified coaches and strict criteria for Under 10s, 12s, 14s and 16s age groups. NFLFC

appoint Steve Pritchard as Centre Director.

**2007/2008** New management and support teams for the Senior Set up is headed up with Lisa Dawkins at the helm for the 1st Team and Mark White for the Senior Reserves.

Club win National F.A 'Club of the Year' Award

1st Team promoted to the National Division by winning the Northern Premiership Title going unbeaten for the whole season.

Club given Nottingham City Council Civic Reception

**2008/2009** Club embarks on National Division campaign – playing at the highest league level in women's football and maintain their position for the 2009/10 season.

**2009/10** Club maintains National Division status due to the planned commencement of the Super League in March 2011. Lisa Dawkins takes on a new role as Director of Football but remains as assistant to the newly appointed manager Danny Johnson.

**2010/11** The 1st team finish runners-up in the National Division and reach the Women's Premier League Cup Final losing to Barnet in a penalty shoot out.

Nottingham Forest Ladies fail in their bid to maintain the Centre of Excellence licence so a new junior section is formed. U11, U13, U15 and U18 teams will play in the Notts Girls and Ladies League for the 2011/12 season.

Forming part of the Leeds United Girls Centre of Excellence is the Under 11 team that offers a competitive start and pathway to youth and senior football within the female side of the club.

Currently, the team has 12 girls registered who train twice weekly and have the opportunity to play regular matches against other centres at the weekend.

Part of the changes incurred this year increased the age bands by one year which, from being U10 last season, allowed Kevin Parkinson and Jenny Fulcher to work again with seven players from the previous squad of players at U11. These players were joined by the girls who were successful during the three weeks of summer trials.

The challenge is to instil the right ethics and positively influence their development at this tender age with an aim for the players to subsequently progress completely through the centre in joining the senior ladies side. In being further equipped, the next success story would be to gain honours at international level!

So far this season, there has been a focus on forward passing, receiving and pressuring of the ball which has always been supplemented with basic ball control. There is a good mix of practice at the two training venues at the High Schools of Knottingley and Boston Spa High



School where attention is always given to the fundamental movement skills of agility, balance and co-ordination.

In terms of matches, results have been mainly favourable for the team with two defeats in twelve matches that include games of shorter duration within a football festival but more pleasing has been features of individual performances where there has been evidence of learning derived from the training ground.

Whilst training follows a defined monthly programme of topics with key coaching elements, there is flexibility to include particular areas arising out of matches. There has been work on team shape and positional sense including cover play which has helped the team be "hard to beat". The sessions are planned around "Working in the Four Corners" of the Football Association model that is designed to challenge the technique, psychological, physical and social aspects of the players.

Each match is played in a 7 v 7 format usually in four quarters of 15 minutes and in offering the girls the opportunity to play in different playing positions, this contributes highly towards their own personal development. There is also a philosophy to providing each player with a similar amount of playing time in competitive matches by the season end **where performances will** form part of their overall assessment.

Mid season appraisals are due in December and it is pleasing to date that there will be marked progress to report.

Whilst it can be said that the signs so far are encouraging, the challenge is to continue with the progression of these young footballers in their formative years who are so important to the future of the centre and the female game in general.
